

CITY OF ROSENBERG WATER AND SEWER RATES INCREASE EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, 2007.

The continued use of well water may cause subsidence and reduce groundwater supply. In an effort to reduce Rosenberg's dependency on well water, the Fort Bend Subsidence District mandated the City comply with a plan to convert from well water to surface water. To fund the Surface Water Conversion directive, the City is adding a surcharge of \$0.35 per 1,000 gallons of water delivered up to 5,000 gallons and \$0.40 per 1,000 gallons over 5,000 gallons. This surcharge will appear as a separate line item on all residential and commercial utility invoices.

Additionally, sewer rates will increase by 12%. The increase will be used to help finance the improvements to the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant No. 2; a project required to meet compliance with a TCEQ Enforcement Order. The minimum charge for 2,000 gallons will increase from \$9.04 to \$10.12 for residential and commercial accounts. Rates for usage over the stated minimums follow:
